n a bid to renew Sierra Leone's struggling economy and tackle growing differences, the presidential candidate for the Republic National Independent Party (ReNIP), Beresford Victor Williams has on Sunday, June 18th, in Bo City, launched its manifesto in which he outlines a comprehensive roadmap for the nation's future.

While speaking to party stakeholders and supporters during the event, Williams said his aim to become a President is to "take control" and bring about substantial improvements for the people of Sierra Leone.

Addressing the current situation faced by the country, the ReNIP leader emphasised the urgent need for change and pledged that his party would be the party to deliver the people from suffering.

He said the manifesto highlights the party's commitment to socialism and the restoration of Sierra Leone's economy through bold and decisive

ReNIP Leader added that his key areas of focus, as outlined in the manifesto, including raising the minimum wage to Le1.5 million, implementing price control, reducing fuel costs to Le16,000, and effectively managing inflation.

he Commonwealth Observer Group has yesterday, 19th . June, revealed their presence in a press conference held at the Radisson Blu Mammy Yoko Hotel, Aberdeen in Freetown.

"Over the coming days we will be meeting stakeholders including the Electoral Commission for Sierra Leone, government representatives, political parties, security agencies, civil society groups, citizen and international observer groups, diplomats, and the media, from the 22nd June. We will deploy our observers in small teams across various parts of the country to observe the voting, counting and results process, as well as meet with other stakeholders in respective locations," he said.

Prof. Osinbanjo further noted that He concluded that on election day, they will observe the opening voting, closing, counting and the results management processes, ending that they will issue an interim statement on their preliminary findings on the 26th of June, before members of the Group depart Sierra Leone on the 30th of June.

"A final report will then be prepared and submitted to the Commonwealth Secretary General, and subsequently shared with relevant stakeholders and made publicly available," he climaxed.



Terra Leone achieved a significant milestone on 6 June when it was elected to a non-permanent seat on the UN Security Council for the Cooperation, Prof. David Francis spoke to Africa Renewal's Kingsley Ighobor on what this means for Sierra Leone and Africa, and the priorities that the country intends to promote during its tenure. The following excerpts are from the interview:

What is the significance of this achievement for your country, but also for Africa?

Today marks a momentous day for Sierra Leone. We are returning to the UN Security Council in the non-permanent category after 53 years. Being voted for by 188 countries [there are 193 UN member states] is a demonstration of the respect for Sierra Leone.

Sierra Leone is no longer defined by its troubled past. Today we are considered a liberal, progressive, confident and enterprising nation.

As you know Sierra Leone is the Chair of the African Union Committee of 10 (C-10) for the reform of the UN Security Council. Algeria, another C-10 member, was today also elected to the nonpermanent category of the Security Council. This means that in 2024 and 2025, two C-10 members will amplify our collective voice to promote and defend the common African position for the reform of the UN Security Council.

What factors have contributed to your lengthy absence from the UN Security Council, and how were you able to get back in?

Sierra Leone's absence can be attributed to several factors, including a difficult period marked by a brutal civil war, bad governance and near-state failure.

When you are in a period of bad governance, inefficient political and economic management of the state and civil war, you don't have time to come to the UN Security Council. Nobody will vote for you because they will not respect you.

However, the country was able to regain its position through a series of positive developments. The interventions of the UN and the West African peacekeeping force, ECOMOG, played a crucial role in helping Sierra Leone recover from the civil war and rebuild itself.

In 2018, Sierra Leone was ranked as one of the most corrupt countries in the world. However, through focused efforts, Sierra Leone managed to improve its score on the Millennium Challenge Corporation's Control of Corruption index, from 49% in 2018 to 83%, in 2022.



Kenya signs EU trade deal boosting Brussels' ties in Africa

enya and the European Union signed a trade agreement on Monday at a ceremony in Nairobi, the first major deal since 2016 with an African country where Brussels is seeking to forge closer economic ties and counter Chinese appetite.

Kenya and the European Union have signed a trade deal in a coup for Brussels as it seeks deeper economic ties with Africa in the face of competition

Kenyan President William Ruto presided over a ceremony in Nairobi on Monday to mark the formal conclusion of negotiations for the EU-Kenya Economic Partnership Agreement.

Once ratified and entered into force, Kenya will receive duty-free and quota-free access to the EU, its biggest market where it sends roughly one-fifth of all

Imports from the EU to Kenya such as chemicals and machinery will receive progressive tariff reductions over a period of 25 years, but some sensitive products will be excluded.

Today is a very proud moment for Kenya, and I believe a very proud moment for the European Union," Kenyan Trade Minister Moses Kuria said after signing the accord with EU Trade Commissioner Valdis Dombrovskis.

Kenya's main exports to the EU are agricultural products, including vegetables, fruits and the country's famous tea and coffee.

More than 70 percent of Kenya's cut flowers are destined for Europe.

Ruto, who said the FU was "the second most important development partner for Kenya after the World Bank" said the country's farmers could be "assured of a predictable market" and the agreement provides new opportunities to boost this trade

"It ensures a stable market for industrialists, for our farmers, and also industrialists in the European Union," he said.

Dombrovskis said EU companies had invested 1 billion euros (\$1.1bn) in Kenya in the past decade, but that there was "a strong appetite" to do more

"With this deal in place, we have the right platform to do so," he said.

It is the first broad trade deal between the EU and an African nation since 2016 and follows a spending spree by China on lavish infrastructure projects across the continent.

The EU has taken steps to counter China's Belt and Road program, announcing in February it would increase investments in Kenya by hundreds of millions of dollars through its own Global Gateway

It is part of a trend of African nations being wooed by Western partners in recent years as Russia and China increasingly gain a foothold in Africa.

Dombrovskis said the East African powerhouse was "a beacon of dynamism and opportunity", echoing the international perception of Kenya's relative stability in what remains a turbulent region.

In a briefing with reporters before Monday's ceremony, Dombrovskis said Africa was a *priority region" for the EU, and he hoped the Kenya deal would "be a boost" to future trade links with Africa.

The Kenya deal is the culmination of trade talks between the EU and the East African Community (EAC) that started roughly a decade ago.

In 2014, the EU and the EAC, then Kenya, Rwanda, Uganda, Burundi and Tanzania finalized negotiations for an economic partnership agreement, but only Nairobi ended up ratifying it.

Kenya went its own way, but Dombrovskis said the agreement remained open for other members of the EAC, which now includes the Democratic Republic of the Congo and South Sudan, to join.

He said: "I would like to take this opportunity, as the team leader, to express my sincere gratitude to the Government of Sierra Leone, the Ministry of Sports, the National Sports Authority, the National Olympic Committee, the President and the Executive Members of the National Paralympic Committee for choosing us to represent our country."
